OUR MISSION AND PROGRAM

CSFB

CSFB remains Baltimore's only need-based, non-denominational program providing low-income Baltimore City families with tuition assistance for their children to attend K – 8th grade at the school of their choice.

CSFB provided tuition assistance to 175 children at 48 different schools this year. Scholarships are always partial; no one gets a "full ride." Families must pay a minimum of \$500 per year of tuition, although most end up paying significantly more.

Most CSFB families select schools in their communities strengthening the economic base of Baltimore City.

For the 2012-2013 school year, we will serve 230 students – a 31% increase.

IMPROVING GRADUATION RATES & TEST SCORES

CSF Scholars are more likely to graduate than their public school peers, as demonstrated by studies in the Bay Area, Charlotte, Denver, and Philadelphia.

Studies of CSF Scholars in Baltimore, Charlotte, Los Angeles, Memphis, and Philadelphia found their test scores were higher than those of their counterparts in nearby public schools.

COST-EFFECTIVE

The private schools CSF Scholars attend typically spend one-third to one-half what neighboring public schools spend per student with much better results.

CSF scholarships demonstrate that a relatively small philanthropic investment, combined with a contribution from the parent, can provide a private school education and a better chance of graduating from high school.

CLOSING THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP

Harvard evaluations of our program in three cities (New York, Washington, DC, and Dayton) showed that scholarships narrow the achievement gap between black and white students in math and reading by about half.
